*From the pen
of Pastor Mark*

Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Resurrected Christ,

What shall we do this Easter season, to glorify the Risen Lord in thanks and praise for all that God's Son has done for us? Last year for the Easter season I invited you to go a little deeper. Since we're in Holy Week as I write this, I wanted to start with what I shared last Holy Week:

"Let's go deeper this Holy Week and holy season of Easter. Dip your finger into the font and make the sign of the cross on your forehead when you come into worship, and dip into the waters of new life that can only come from Christ this spring. Come to the table for Maundy Thursday to receive the meal, and then go out into the world, fed and nourished, to share God's love with a world that is so hungry for it right now. Come to Good Friday, wear a cross to remind you and others of the cross of Christ, and wear that cross out into the world, not only on your chest as a necklace, but in your heart, bound in love to your Lord. Come to the Vigil and come to Easter, to celebrate an empty cross and an empty tomb, reminding us that all the promises of the devil are also empty, and that Christ is Lord of all.....of heaven and earth, of life and death, of forgiveness and love, of everything finite and of all eternity."

I invite you to all the same things this year too, and perhaps along with going deeper, let's consider going a bit *wider* this year! Our Easter Good News of the Risen Savior is incredible. Let's ask ourselves, "How can I reach a little wider, sharing this incredible Good News in creative ways with people I haven't before?" How can we share God's *love*? Love is *doing*, it is action. What can I do to stretch just a bit further in sharing God's love? It could seem like a daunting challenge. Or it could be a fun and creative adventure. Love is also *being*. God is love, as we hear in 1st John. How does my very personhood, my very being, more fully reflect God's love as I go out into the world? This too can be a fun adventure.

So this year, remember the call to love one another, as our Lord has first loved us. Remember the gift of the Holy Meal, of the body and blood given and shed for us. Remember the King of Kings, who modeled servanthood in washing his disciples' feet. Remember the cross, and our Lord's free choice to suffer and die for us and for our sins. Remember His rising and conquering even death itself, with the promise not only of forgiveness and redemption, but of life abundant here and also life eternal. That's a lot of great news to share! Each element of Holy Week and Easter is an incredible reminder of just how deeply and fully we are loved.

So let's go out into the world this Easter season, to live and share God's love in action and in our very being; in new ways, creative ways, a little wider than we've done before:

Loving, living, serving, giving, in God's name.

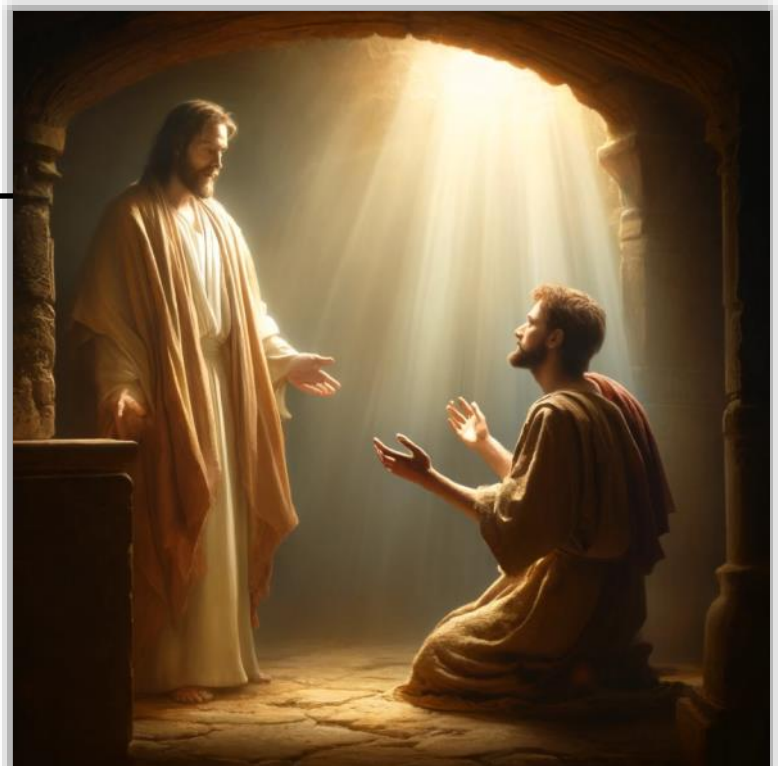

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

As we emerge from winter and the season of Lent into spring and Easter, I am enjoying watching God's creation emerge from its slumber and grow into newness of life. A fitting connection to Easter. It is during this season that I am reminded that we are also called to be good stewards of Creation. From the very beginning God makes clear that we have an obligation to care for the earth:

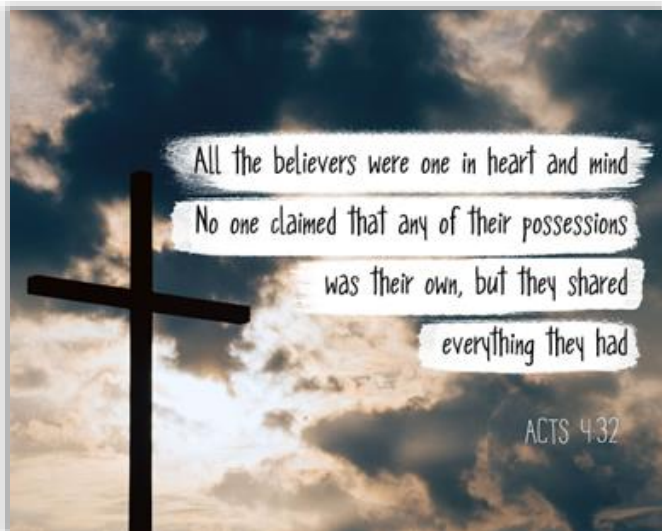
*The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden

Caring for creation doesn't have to mean driving electric cars or becoming vegans, though those may reduce one's "carbon footprint." From Your HT Stephen Ministry Team

Five congregation members will be completing 50 hours of intensive training this month (Jan.-Apr.) and will be commissioned on Sunday, April 28th at the 11:00 am service. A reception will follow the service in the Fellowship Hall. We would like everyone to come and support our new Stephen Ministers. A special thank you to Johnson Ferry Baptist Church for providing this training to our members.

What is Stephen Ministry? Stephen Ministry is a not-for-profit Christian organization that was established in 1975 in St. Louis by Lutheran Pastor Dr. Kenneth Haugk. This is a caring, Christian-based ministry.

Why Stephen? Our name comes from St. Stephen in the Book of Acts. He was the first layperson the Apostles asked to care for the needs of that early congregation. (Acts 6:1-6).

New Stephen Ministers: Carol Altgilbers, Amy Cassaniti, Lois Collier, Sharon Mazna and Linda Wagner.

Who is a Stephen Minister? He/She is a lay congregation member that is trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or family issues. They have learned skills and developed gifts for bringing Christ's healing love to people.

What is the training they receive? Training covers topics such as caring ministry, assertive training, spiritual gifts discovery, grief support, and spiritual growth. Stephen Ministers use these resources to strengthen and expand the church's ministry. Individuals use them to improve their ability to relate to and care for others, grow in faith, and journey through life crises.

History of Stephen Ministry at HT: Holy Trinity has one of the oldest continuously operating Stephen Ministry programs in the country. It was established at HT in 1985 by Alice Martin (Pastor Martin's wife) and Pastor Dee Donnelly. More than 67 lay people from HT have been trained over the years. Sadly, most of those have passed away, moved away or retired as Stephen Ministers. We have six current members who are active Stephen Ministers; Carolyn Robinson Klein, Diane Mathis, Tom Mathis, Annette Norton, Patti Ritter and Carol Skildum. With the addition of our new Stephen Ministers, we will have an active team of 11 SMs. Our retired Stephen Ministers include Alice Rohrbach, Cullene Harper, Sandra Williams, Gloria Hutt, Marcia Pedersen, Jan Berkholtz, Jerry Gorley and Ralph Williams.

FOR HABITAT

Special Notice: The April special envelope is for the Lutheran Coalition for Habitat.

Over the last couple of years real estate values have risen sharply, the cost of construction material has been impacted by persistent inflation, the demand for affordable housing has increased and mortgage rates have remained high. The mission of Habitat for Humanity is to create affordable housing options. It is now more important than ever. The Lutheran Coalition for Habitat has sponsored 33 homes since 1993. For 2024, the 34th home will be constructed on Grigg Street in Marietta. The Lutheran Coalition is a consortium of 12 Metro Atlanta Lutheran Churches. Each year our goal is to sponsor 50% of a new Habitat build. This has become increasingly difficult. We will need \$75,000 to \$80,000 to fund 50% of a house for 2025. Please consider a gift to Habitat this Easter.

On March 16, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church began helping to build a Habitat for Humanity house with the Lutheran Coalition for Habitat. The house will be for a community servant such as a teacher or bus driver and will be in Marietta. Work days will be Saturdays from 7:45 pm to 4:00 pm. Below are the activities for each work week:

- April 6** - Siding & Insulation: install the siding and insulation
- TBA** - Exterior Paint: paint the exterior walls, trim, and shutters
- TBA** - Interior Paint Prep: prepare the walls for paint
- TBA** - Interior Paint: first coat of paint
- TBA** - Interior Paint & Trim: second coat of paint
- TBA** - Complete the House: install hardware and complete the final touches
- TBA** - Landscaping: lay sod, plant shrubs, and install the mailbox
